Dr. Ed Connor was initially trained in psychotherapy at the Vallmotorp Foundation in Katrineholm, Sweden from 1983-1986. He earned his B.A. in Psychology at Thomas More College in 1989 and his doctorate degree in clinical psychology from the University of Denver in Colorado in 1993. He completed a clinical and forensic internship at the University of North Carolina Memorial Hospital at Chapel Hill, North Carolina in their Department of Psychiatry, and with the Federal Correctional Institution at Butner, North Carolina in their Forensic Evaluation Unit and the Sexual Offenders Treatment Unit. His internship at UNC-Chapel Hill focused primarily on child and adult assessment, family therapy, and child sexual abuse.

After his internship, Dr. Connor was the Clinical Psychologist at DCH Regional Medical Center's in-patient psychiatric unit in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, where he provided assessments and treatment as well as psychological evaluations for the Probate Court for commitment. He also had a part-time private practice where he conducted various forensic-related assessments and psychotherapy for the courts, police officers' "fitness for duty" assessments, family treatment, and child custody evaluations.

Currently, Dr. Connor is in private practice where he provides general and forensic treatment and psychological assessments. These duties include child custody evaluations, pre-employment public safety evaluations at the city and county level, public safety promotion exams, general psychotherapy for adolescents, adults, families, and couples, as well as Sex Offender Risk Assessments and sex offender treatment for juveniles and adults at the State and Federal level. Dr. Connor also treats adolescents and adults for Internet Pornography addiction and other sexual disorders.

Dr. Connor is licensed to practice in Kentucky, Indiana and Ohio. He is a member of the Kentucky Psychological Association (KPA). Dr. Connor is a Certified Domestic Violence Treatment Provider and is approved by the Commonwealth of Kentucky as a Sex Offender Risk Assessment and Treatment Provider and a clinical member of the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers (ATSA). He is the co-author of a published journal article on psychologists' ability to detect malingering and a contributor to an article on the use of the MCMI-III in Child Custody Evaluations.
